Junior Golf Clinics—Begin June 15th

In 2010, we are introducing the Cedar Chase Golf Academy.

On June 15, The Golf Academy will be hosting Program 1 of the 2010 Junior Golf Clinic. Program 2 begins on July 27th. Each Program will last 4 sessions and costs only \$39 for the Program 1 or 2. If you can't make all the sessions a charge of \$15 per

session can be assessed.

The Junior Golfers will be classified by age. 14 years and up will begin at 9am—10am, ages 11—13 will be 10:15—11:15, and 10 and under will be 11:30 to 12:30.

Tip from the Golf Professional

A Key to success on the Golf Course is PREPERATION.

Developing a pre-shot routine that fits you will help improve your score immediately.

Our Brain must be in the “right” state of mind in order for us to play golf well. So while you're on the practice tee come up with something that helps get your mind in the proper state for you to swing the club well. Once, satisfied with that routine, try it on the course. Modify as needed.

For example, this is what I do during my pre-shot routine. Once I have selected the club for the shot, I stand behind the ball and visualize the shot that is going to take place. After I am satisfied with the result of the visualization, I take a very slow practice half swing that helps me understand that I have to swing during a certain “time” and tempo. I then begin approaching my setup during that same “time” and now I am ready to swing the club with the right mind set. Try something similar and see how it works for you! Good Luck! June is Take Care of the Course Month!

We would like your help in keeping Cedar Chase in outstanding shape.

On each of the Golf Carts there are 2 bottles that are filled with sand. After each divot you make please grab one of the bottles and fill the divot in with the sand. This will help the roots of the grass stay alive and continue to grow.

We would also like to remind everyone of the proper procedure for fixing ball marks on the greens. By taking your ball mark repair tool, stick into the ground around the edge of the divot and push toward the center, rather than trying to lift the divot up. This allows for the grass roots to stay intact and stay healthy. For more information on how you can help the course stay nice. Visit usga.org.

Count the number of ball marks you fixed on a scorecard and turn it in at the end of your round. Word from the Superintendent

With Memorial Day upon us one of the questions I hear most is when should I fertilize my lawn.

The answer is to have it done around Easter. My program for my lawn is pretty simple that way it is easy to remember. I fertilize my yard on or around the five holidays during the Spring, Summer and Fall. Easter, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day and Thanksgiving. I put down Milorganite, which is an organic fertilizer made in Milwaukee, at a heavy rate.

The great thing about this fertilizer is it will never burn your turf and you can use it in any weather!

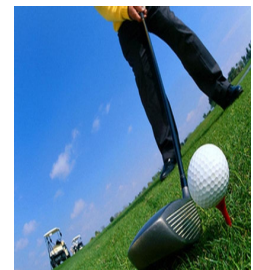
